To Whom It May Concern:

Several weeks ago, I was working at a site in Geelong when I was approached by the new Kanga rep in this area. He informed me that the Kanga 7 series was equal to the K9-4 that I currently owned and their 8 series was a mile ahead of the k9-4. He was so confident that he was prepared to put the 2 machines side by side. The next time I spoke to my Dingo rep, a few days later and told him about my conversation with Kanga, he encouraged me to go back to Kanga and arrange a side by side demo. This I did and also invited the Eagle mini digger.

The machines on site were:

- The Dingo K9-4Y II,
- The Dingo K9-3K,
- The Kanga 8 Series and
- The Eagle.


We started with the machines in a line doing a 6' trench.

- The Dingo K9-4 trenched 20m to a depth of 600mm, in a similar time,
- The Eagle trenched approx. 16m to a depth of 700mm,
- And the Kanga 8 series trenched approx. 12m to a depth of 400mm, while
- The Dingo K9-3 trenched a 4" trench approx. 15m to a depth of 600mm in the same time.

Next, each machine augered a 600mm hole.

- The K9-4 went to a depth of approx. 800mm in 4 min 15 sec,
- The Eagle took 4 min 30 secs to a similar depth while
- The 8 Series Kanga took approx. 15 min to a depth of about 500mm.

The Dingo K9-4 was clearly the most powerful machine on display with superior trenching and augering ability. I was also impressed with the K9-3, which despite, on paper being the least powerful and by far the cheapest of the 4 machines, held it's own very well.
